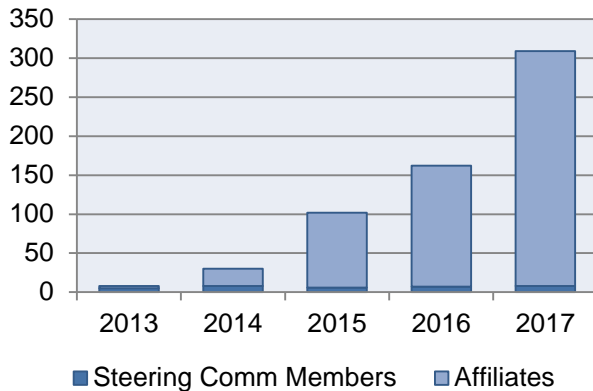

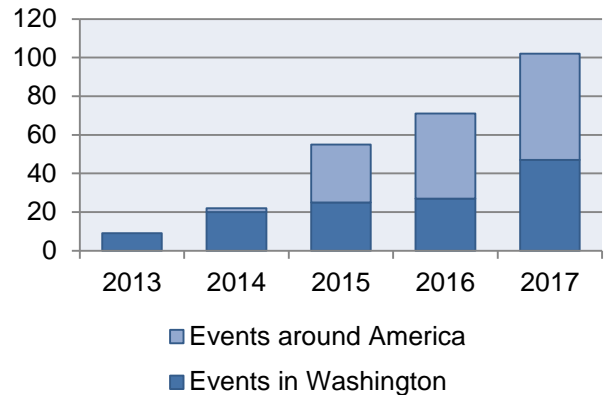

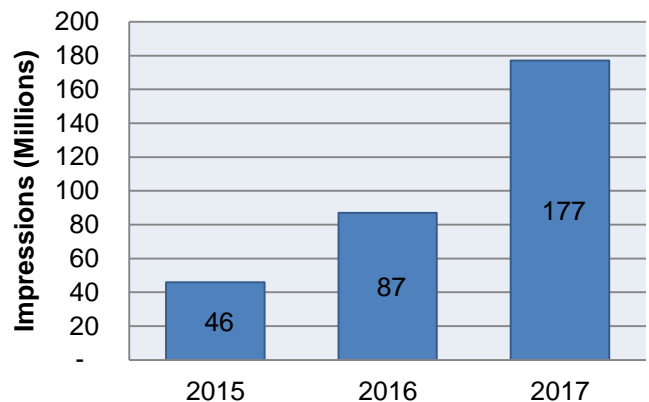


## Social Media Reach

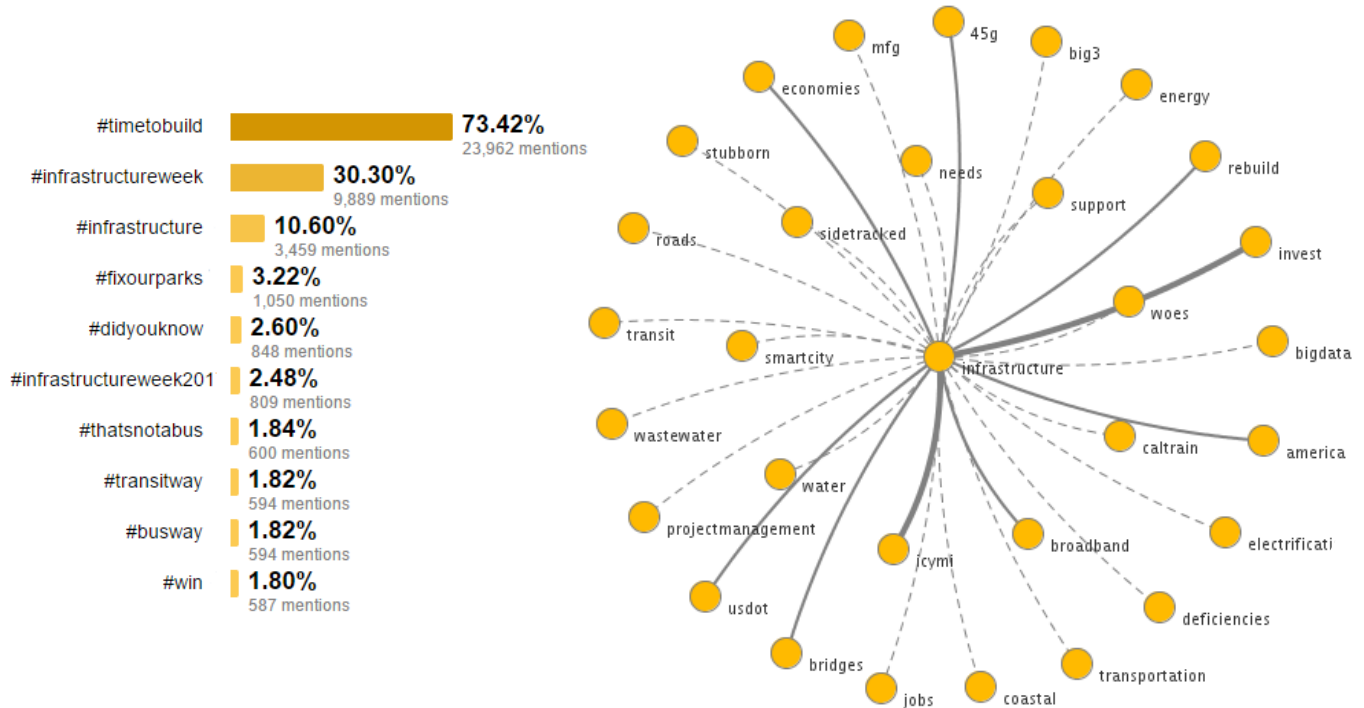
